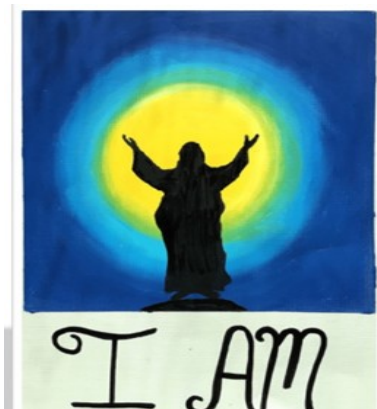

COORDINATING COUNCIL

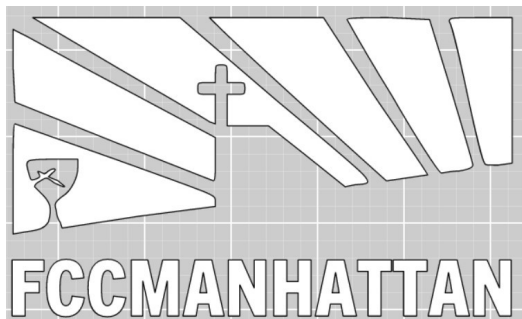

Many of these options (short-term and long-term) can be coalesced together for the benefit of the giver and FCC. The current program, titled “**Giving of Our Treasures Program**” has been updated to include changes in the tax laws. **Copies are available in the church office.**

Collectively, they gain crucial market access and decide how to invest fair trade and organic premiums in their communities. Equal Exchange now sources from over 40 small farmer organizations around the world.

SOMETIMES IT IS JUST HARD TO BE POSITIVE....

I need to develop a better attitude in 2024. I know this will not be easy. I tend to dwell on the things that irritate me like poor road conditions, roundabout construction, the relentless barrage of computer or phone scams, the Chiefs receivers dropping yet another catchable pass. It is exhausting....this can really wear a guy out! Perhaps there are alternative means of dealing with things of this nature instead of letting them get to me.

There is no shortage of studies or action plans dealing with overcoming negativity. A quick Google search rendered 30,900,644 results. Evidently, I am not alone in seeking to be more positive.

It will take effort to flush out these thoughts and replace them with gratitude and joy. Will it be worth the effort? I believe it can and should be worth it.

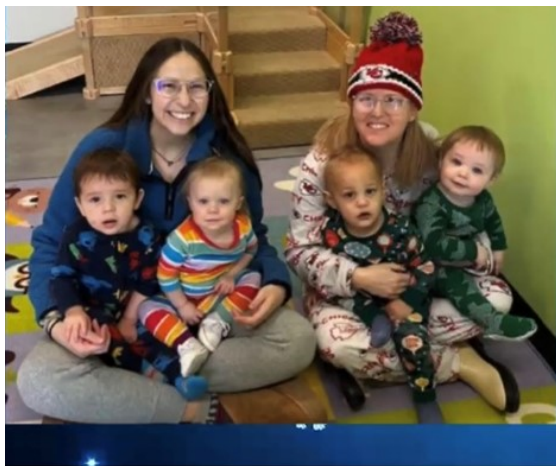
